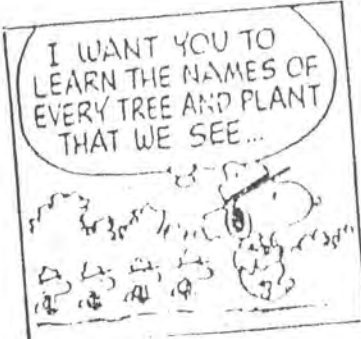

When you have five students and work, travel and eat together in a five week class you get to know them well and that is one of the best things about Mt. Lake. The 1995 Plant Systematics class was one of the best I have had at Mt. Lake. They were all undergraduates about to enter their junior years. That made them most even class I have ever had at the station.

There were several significant first occurrences in this my fifth time to teach at the station.

I had never had a student get lost...

I lost one of my students, Brent Burroughs, for more than forty minutes on a field trip. I never was worried though because Brent is from the midwest and has some of that pioneer spirit of self reliance and independence. I am sure that is what led him to go off on his own that afternoon.
