





When you have five students and work, travel and eat together in a five week class you get to know them well and that is one of the best things about Mt. Lake. The 1995 Plant Systematics class was one of the best I have had at Mt. Lake. They were all undergraduates about to enter their junior years. That made them most even class I have ever had at the station.

There were several significant first occurrences in this my fifth time to teach at the station.

I had never had a student get lost...

I lost one of my students, Brent Burroughs, for more than forty minutes on a field trip. I never was worried though because Brent is from the midwest and has some of that pioneer spirit of self reliance and independence. I am sure that is what led him to go off on his own that afternoon. I did not realize that he had missed out on the planning of the trip by wearing headphones and listening to rock music in the van as we descended the mountain, planning our attack on the produce section of the Kroger. When we arrived at the Kroger Brent went shopping and the rest of us went systematically through the vegetables and fruits. Three shoppers followed us for the lecture and Brent showed up at the checkouts to our relief. What an embarrassment it would have been if we had left him in the Kroger.

Like another like first for me was like to have to like learn to like understand "valley speak" from Miriam Heuhsen. It is like a whole new like language. Seven likes and a split infinitive in like really only two sentences. OK, Miriam which one of the likes is like used the way it like should be?

Duc Le was the first student that I let drive on a field trip. Never again! Accelerator pressure and smooth acceleration must have been skipped in his driver education course back in New York.


